Pond Restoration

I am pleased to report that we have raised sufficient funds to pay for the pond restoration. It has been quite a journey and I am delighted to say that so many people clearly share our vision of the Green and especially the pond.

We needed to raise £15,000 for this one off project. The response to our appeal was amazing with many donations from local residents as well as some specific individual fund raising initiatives:

- One lady sold a dolls house that her father made for her many years ago and donated the proceeds of £200 to the pond fund. That must have been some dolls house!

- Along with a donation of £100, we received a letter saying "As long standing residents of Sunnybank the Millennium Green and pond have been part of our lives here and we care deeply that it continues to thrive. Looking for the ducklings each year - and finding them - is one of the highlights".

- A donation came from a lady who has lived on the Woodcote Estate since 1957 which says a lot about the local area! She said how much she enjoys the progress reports that we issue in our Newsletter.

- One resident suggested holding a cake sale during our maintenance session in October. We did and we sold cakes and flowers which proved very popular. This raised an amazing £271, that's a lot of cakes and flowers!!!!

- A local resident, who is a fully qualified personal trainer, came up with the idea of running group fitness sessions on the Green. The voluntary donations for these sessions went towards the pond restoration project. This has been well attended and is great fun and we are delighted to report that the sessions are going to continue at 9:00am on Saturday mornings. Any future funds raised will contribute towards on-going maintenance of the pond. The suggested donation is £2 per person.

In addition to individual contributions we looked at other ways to secure the necessary funding and applied to a number of organisations for grants.

- The Epsom Civic Society (ECS) invited us to one of their meetings to talk about the Millennium Green Trust and the pond restoration. The ECS were considering making a donation towards the restoration project and were particularly interested in understanding our plans for the long term protection of the green and the historical pond. I am delighted to report that they decided to make a generous pledge of £5,000. The award was conditional upon the Trust raising £10,000 for the project.

- We contacted the Lower Mole Countryside Trust, and submitted two applications for funding. We were successful with both and were awarded £500 towards the clearing of the trees around the pond and £500

towards the refurbishment of the pond itself. There was a caveat attached whereby we had to raise the funds for the tree clearing and then the outstanding sum before the grant would become available.

- We wrote to our Surrey County Councillor who kindly supported our application, following which we were awarded £4,500 from the Community Partnership Team.

Additionally:

- We set up a facebook page to keep people informed. This is now also the best place to keep up to date with our news and events in between the newsletter.

- We invited What's on in Epsom to a maintenance session where they broadcast live from the Green.

- We published an appeal for funds in a local newspaper.

- We created a Mydonate online donation page to make it easier for people to make a donation.

All together, a successful campaign. A very big thank you to all of you who contributed to this, we are extremely grateful.

Tree Clearing – Pond Refurbishment

And so, the first phase of the pond refurbishment has started!

You will have seen that just before Christmas some of the trees surrounding the pond were either removed or drastically cut back. Water acts as a “magnet” to leaves and we were advised that part of our ongoing maintenance should include keeping trees away from the pond this will help to reduce the levels of silt build up making it harder for weeds to flourish.

Future fundraising

We are delighted to say that we have been shortlisted by Tesco for their community fund award scheme called ‘Tesco Bags of Help Grant Scheme’. During March and April shoppers in local Tesco stores will be able to vote for their favourite project. Please do vote for us. Any grant if we are fortunate enough to receive one will contribute towards on-going pond maintenance.

The next phase is to remove the silt and weed from the pond. We are planning to have this complete by the end of March.

Smoking

The cigarette butt boxes recently donated by Epsom Hospital are being used which is some relief as it does make the areas around the seats and benches nicer. These continue to be monitored and emptied on a regular basis.

Substation near Woodcote Hurst

Following demolition of the old building by the substation, the temporary fence has now been replaced with a permanent wooden fence which is a welcome improvement to the area.
